- 7. Flooding of streams or impassable road conditions

When you check in, we ask you give your callsign slowly and phonetically, along with your name and the location you are reporting from. Please do not check in until the previous station has been acknowledged. Following checkins, I will call you back for any comments or information you may have for the net.

I will now take checkins from any mobile, handheld, low power, or in-and-out stations. (Comments for the net).

I will now take checkins from fixed stations. (Comments for the net).

I'd like to thank everyone for checking into the net.
