**Note to Net Control Operators** – Please make note of the start time, the end time and the callsigns of each participant.

- 6. Thunderstorm damage
- 7. Flooding of streams or impassable road conditions

When you check-in we ask you give your call sign slowly and phonetically, along with your name and the location you are reporting from. Please do <u>not</u> check in until the previous station has been acknowledged. Following check-ins, I will call you back for any comments or information you may have for the net.

I will now take check-ins from any mobile, handheld, low power, or in-and-out stations. (Comments for the net)

I will now check-ins from any fixed stations. (Comments for the net)

I'd like to thank everyone for checking into the net.
